Example of Profile (Rep. of Korea)

- 1-1. Natural Hazards likely to Affect the Country Wind storm, typhoon, flood, drought, heavy snow, and etc
- 1-2. Recent Major Disasters

Torrential Rains on 2-8 Aug and 8-11 Aug 2005, with description of an effective early warning by media (KBS)

2. Disaster Management System

Natural Disaster Countermeasures Act (enacted in 1995) Disaster and Safety Management Basic Law (in June 2004) NEMA (restructured in 2005)

3. Disaster Management Plan

Sixth basic Disaster Prevention Plan Period (2002-2006)



Example of Profile (Rep. of Korea-Cont'd)

- 4. Budget size on national level
 - US \$300 M (in addition to national funded project)
- 5. Progress and Situations of the Hyogo Framework for Action (HFA)
 - Strong Commitment to ACDR2006, as hosting country
- 6. Projects on disaster reduction headed by the Ministry in the last 2 years
 - Steep Slope Safety Management and Disaster Reduction Act (18,000 sites for target)
- 7. Counterpart of ADRC
 - National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA)



Example of Profile (Japan)

- 1-1. Natural Hazards likely to Affect the Country
 Almost all kinds, incl. earthquake and snow avalanche
- 1-2. Recent Major Disasters
 - Niigata Chuetsu Earthquake in Oct 2004, as a National Response
- 2. Disaster Management System
 - Admi. (national, prefectural, municipal), Legal (Disaster Countermeasures Basic Act in 1961), Structural (Central Disaster Management Council)
- 3. Disaster Management Plan
 - Basic Disaster Management Plan (amended in July 2005)



Example of Profile (Japan-Cont'd)

- 4. Budget size on national level
 - US \$34 billion (5% of general-account budget expenditure)
- 5. Progress and Situations of the Hyogo Framework for Action (HFA)
 - All Priorities: 1 to 5 are covered and implemented
- 6. Projects on disaster reduction headed by the Ministry in the last 2 years
 - Priority for Action 4 (ratio of old house s 25% to 10% in 10 years)
- 7. Counterpart of ADRC
 - Cabinet Office (Coordinating body across all lined Ministry)



Applications of the Profiles

- 1. Comparison among ADRC Members
 - -What is attained, and what will be needed
 - -Reference for other Members
- 2. Reference for UN and International organizations
- -ADRC Counterpart's needs can be identified
 - 3. Benchmark: Towards 2015
- Tracking if we are on right lane with right pace

- - ADRC needs continued support from Members




Publication of "TDRM : Good Practices"


"TDRM: Good Practices" has been published on the occasion of the World Conference on Disaster Reduction

(28 Good Practices in 15 Asian countries)



















Applications of the Good Practices
