



- From emergency oriented to more on prevention, mitigation, and recovery




#### Priority for Action 2

Identify, assess and monitor disaster risks and enhance early warning

- Promotion of Glide (Global Unique Disaster Identifier) system in collaboration with UN/ISDR, UNDP, WMO, CRED...
- Launching Sentinel Asia Project with JAXA to provide images from the satellite ALOS to member countries and JPT members
- Damage assessment mission to disaster affected countries (Indonesia, Philippines, Solomon Island)
- Developing Community Based Hazard Mapping Methodology

#### Priority for Action 3



- Training for local officers on disaster management (Japan's Initiative for ASEAN)
