ADRC Participated Exhibition and Workshop for Earthquake Disaster Reduction at Marikina City, Philippines

From July 28th to 29th, 2003, ADRC was invited by the Earthquake Disaster Mitigation Research Center (EDM) to the Exhibition and Workshop for Earthquake Disaster Reduction at Marikina City, Philippines. The title of the exhibition was "Preserving Marikina's Future through Earthquake Disaster Reduction". The objectives were to disseminate information about risk of the possible West Valley Fault Earthquake to the citizens and to demonstrate the countermeasures to the Marikina City Government Officials.

ADRC made a presentation with posters entitled "Strengthening **Preparedness** through Communications among Residents" and introduced "Town Watching Method" and "Community Based Evacuation Map" for risk awareness. More than 300 citizens, including high school students, visited the exhibition and eagerly listened to the explanation

about lesson learned Japan. Regarded as effective and costless method. "Town Watching Method' attracted much attention.

On August 30, 2003, 17 Military officers from 13 Asian-Pacific countries paid a visit to ADRC as a part of Japan Self-Defense Agency's multinational cooperation program. Headed by the Colonel of Ground Staff Office at Japan Self-Defense Agency, Mr. Katsushi Okazaki, the participants came to Hyogo, Japan in order to study advanced response of disaster-relief activities.

Executive Director of ADRC, Mr.Nishikawa provided a presentation about ADRC activities. In the following, Sri Lankan Researcher Dr.Sanker showed an example of

Ravindra Samaraweera and Secretary Ms. Vijeyalakshmy Jegarasasingam at their Ministry and discussed how to develop a Disaster

Recent Natural Disasters in Asia:

South Korea - Typhoon Maemi

On September 13, 2003, Typhoon Maemi battered southern areas of South Korea with record winds overnight caused \$1.3 billion in damage, (135mph) leaving 121 people dead or missing and 8,938 people homeless. The typhoon damaged 774 roads, 27 bridges, and submerged 43,027 acres of farmland, the government said in a statement. A total of 465 vessels were destroyed or marooned.
