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

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

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Disaster Management Spectrum








Disaster Management Structure as per NDM Act





PDMA Functions



- Formulation of provincial disaster management
- Coordinate and monitor implementation of the National Policies, National Plans and Provincial Plans
- Examine vulnerability of the Province to different disasters and specify prevention or mitigation
- Lay down guidelines for preparation of Disaster Management Plans
- Evaluate disaster preparedness at all governmental or non-governmental
- Coordinate **response** in event of disaster

- · Promote general education, awareness and community training in this
- Provide necessary technical assistance or give advice to District and Local authorities for carrying out their functions effectively
- Ensures that communication systems are in order and DM drills are being carried




Effects of Climate Change on Pakistan





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National Disaster Management Plan (NDMP)



Background

- NDMA through EAD had requested Government of Japan in 2009 for technical support to formulate DM
- Project commenced in April 2009 and concluded in June 2012
- Over 30 consultations held both at Provincial & Federal
- Actual field surveys were conducted by JICA Team
- The project was finally approved with official title as "The Project for National Disaster Management Plan
- NDMC endorsed the Plan in February 2013

The Plan, prepared in line with NDM Act 2010, aims "enhancing the capacity of the Country to prepare for and respond to disasters (flood, earthquake, tsunami, drought, avalanches, GLOFs, cyclone, storm surge) through various hard and soft interventions"



CHALLENGES FOR THE DM SYSTEM

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Challenges for the Disaster Management



Limited Capability of Meteorological Department

- · Obsolete weather forecasting
- Present capability accurate forecast of only 24 48 hours
- Critical shortage of automatic weather stations and rainfall gauging
- Only 65% coverage of Pakistan by Weather Radars
- 80% area of Balochistan 100% NAs not covered
- Limited coverage of meteorological network at district / tehsil level
- Limited rainfall measuring (KP, GB, Balochistan, AJ&K)



Challenges for the Disaster Management



Limited Capability of Meteorological Department

- Prediction of medium to long range forecasting 7 to 15 days
- Lacks in Quantitative Forecast of Extreme Events (2010 & 2014 floods)
- Accuracy in Seasonal Weather Prediction 50-60 %
- No Upper Air Weather data for Storm Tracking
- No Urban Flood Forecasting System except Isb Rwp
