


More effective integration of disaster risk reduction considerations into sustainable development policies, planning and programming at all levels Development and strengthening of institutions, mechanisms and capacities at all levels, in particular at the community level Systematic incorporation of risk reduction approaches into the design and implementation of emergency preparedness, response and recovery programmes **Priorities for action 2005-2015** 1. Ensure that disaster risk reduction is a national and a local priority with a strong institutional basis for implementation Identify, assess and monitor disaster risks and enhance early warning Use knowledge, innovation and education to build a culture of safety and resilience at Reduce the underlying risk factors Strengthen disaster preparedness for effective response at all levels







## Observations


Most of the countries have national policies, plans and organizations for disaster management
