- General Assembly adopted Resolution 46/182 in 1991 to strengthen the UN's response to complex emergencies and natural disasters.
- Resolution created the position of Emergency Relief Coordinator (ERC).
- OCHA and ISDR both report to the ERC, John Holmes





Tenets of International Natural Disaster Response

- All international assistance is in support of national authorities on request
- The UN General Assembly has mandated the Emergency Relief Coordinator (ERC) to coordinate international response
- Bilateral assistance predominates


