


CONCEPT OF PUBLIC, PRIVATE AND PEOPLE PARTNERSHIP (P4)

- Public, Private and People Partnership (P4) as employed in this project deliberately adds "People" to the concept of PPP. It is to put "people" at the center around which process and outcome of partnership evolve. P4, therefore, takes "people-centered development" as its core approach in building partnership.
- P4 project began with facilitation of village communities to identify disaster risks (risk assessment) and to set their priorities in disaster risk reduction action plan. Community action priority becomes the cornerstone of partnership building with various parties.


CASE OF PACITAN DISTRICT

RESULT-2: PARTNERSHIP PATTERN

OBLIGATION

VOLUNTARISM

[Yellow Quadrant]

combination of activity and/or participation based on obligation and formal communication

[Red Quadrant]

combination of activity and/or participation based on voluntarism and formal communication

FORMAL COMMUNICATION

[Blue Quadrant]

combination of activity and/or participation based on obligation and informal communication

[Green Quadrant]

combination of activity and/or participation based on voluntarism and informal communication

INFORMAL COMMUNICATION

Pattern "Green Quadrant" was the primary choice many stakeholders expect, as it alludes to sustainable, long-term partnership rather than short-term and project-based scheme.

LESSONS LEARNT

- 1. partnership requires initiator, a role that any stakeholder (government, NGO, company, community) can play
- 2. to manage partnership and ensure that it work well, it requires a coordinator who functions as communication hub and gains confidence of all stakeholders involved in collaboration
- 3. to maintain intensive communication among stakeholders in a building partnership, it is necessary to create rooms for discussion
- 4. the spirit of voluntarism is the basis on which mutual trust was built and which enables collaboration among stakeholders
- 5. to collaborate with companies, it is necessary to understand their interests and how they work
- making interest of society a common priority proves to be a strong reason for stakeholders to collaborate
