International Symposium "Living with Risk - disaster reduction for future generations -" to be held on 17 January 2005 in Kobe

The Asian Disaster Reduction Center (ADRC) will hold an international symposium titled "Living with Risk -disaster reduction for future generations-" at Kobe Portopia Hall (in Kobe Portopia Hotel) on 17 January 2005 (15:30-17:30), co-organized by the Cabinet Office (Government of Japan), UN/ISDR, Hyogo Prefecture, and UN /OCHA Kobe, in cooperation with JICA, NHK, IFRC, and WMO. The symposium has a special significance because it coincides with the day of the tenth anniversary of the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake and the day before the United Nations World Conference on Disaster Reduction (WCDR).

The Symposium aims to provide an opportunity to enhance the understanding of the importance of disaster risk reduction and of the need to further strengthen capacities by promoting cooperation and collaboration among various stakeholders, such as local and central governments, UN agencies, international organizations, academia, NGOs, and, ultimately, communities.

Status of Recovery Following the Bam

Earthquake in Iran

ADRC co-organized a workshop entitled "Exchange of Experience for a Safer Life and Decrease of Vulnerability against Earthquake" on 26-28 September 2004 in Tehran, Islamic Republic of Iran, in cooperation with Kobe University (Japan), MPO (Management and Planning Organization) of Iranian Government, and PWIT (Power and Water Institute of Technology, Iran).

The workshop was convened in the conference center of IRIB (Islamic Republic of Iran Broadcasting), gathering more than 500 participants including

renowned experts from inside and outside Iran. Participants from Japan comprised officers from the central government (Japan Meteorological Agency Building and Research Institute), local government and agencies



(Hyogo Prefectural Government, Hyogo Emergency Medical Center, Waterworks Bureau of Kobe City, Department), Amagasaki Municipal Fire and representatives from private the sector TV. telecommunications and gas companies).

Mr. Masayuki Kitamoto, Executive Director of ADRC, delivered a keynote speech on "Earthquake Emergency Response System & Total Disaster Risk Management". Various presentations by the Japanese experts followed to introduce the past experiences and lessons learnt from the Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake and disaster management in Japan.

A survey mission to Bam, where the devastating earthquake occurred on 26 December last year, was organized, following the workshop. Mr. Ishii, Senior Researcher of ADRC, observed many collapsed buildings and heaps of rubbles in the city and that further work was needed for its recovery and reconstruction. The monsoon rains brought by Tropical Depression "Winnie" in late November, triggered massive flooding in the low-lying areas of the northern and central part of the Philippines.
