International Seminar on Post-Disaster **Recovery Drew to a Successful Close**

International Seminar on Post-Disaster Recovery was held, following opening of the International Recovery Platform (IRP) office, from 11 to 13 May 2005 in Kobe, Hyogo, Japan, co-organized by United Nations Development Program (UNDP), United Nations Inter-Agency Secretariat of International Strategy for Disaster Reduction (UN/ISDR), United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UN/OCHA), World Bank (WB), International Labour Organization (ILO), Cabinet Office of Japan, Hyogo Prefectural Government, Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), and Asian Disaster Reduction Center (ADRC). The objectives of the Seminar were;

- (1) To present the current situation of recovery operations in countries affected by natural disasters and highlight the activities on recovery contributing to sustainable economic and social development.
- (2) To identify gaps and challenges in promoting efficient and effective recovery through incorporation of risk reduction.
- (3) To review the current recovery operations of the Indian Ocean Earthquake and Tsunami.

Consisting of plenary and parallel sessions, video conference and public forum, the Seminar gathered over 300 participants including 80 from abroad throughout the Seminar.

The symposium was intended to draw the attention of the public to the proposed IRP's efforts. It also contributed to producing an action plan of IRP.

Following the keynote speech by Dr. Allan Lavell, representatives from Indonesia, the Maldives and MERCY Malaysia (NGO) made presentations on their experiences in recovery from the recent tsunami in the Indian Ocean. Facilitated by Ms. Helena Molin

Valdes of UN/ISDR, a panel discussion was held with five panelists and four commentators, and discussed three points: main a) Reflection on the existing gaps in promoting efficient recovery, b) Proposals for



supporting, solutions, mechanisms and frameworks assisting post disaster recovery, for and c) International support to close the gap between relief and development.
