<u>Asian Conference on Disaster Reduction (ACDR2020):</u> Can we Adapt to a New Normal? -Approaches from Asia– (tentative)

Since its establishment in 1998, ADRC has endeavored to enhance the disaster risk reduction (DRR) capabilities of member countries mainly through information sharing and human resource development activities conducted in cooperation with various organizations. Among these is the Asian Conference on Disaster Reduction (ACDR), which has been held 18 times since 2003 with the goals of promoting information sharing and strengthening partnerships among member countries. The ACDR is an annual conference hosted by one of our member countries. ACDR2020, however, will be held virtually this year due to the worldwide spread of COVID-19.

Despite continued efforts by member countries to implement the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction (SFDRR), the damage caused by natural disasters has increased in recent years. Extreme weather events around the world show that there is an urgent need to execute disaster mitigation and DRR strategies that take climate change into greater consideration, especially in the context of the coronavirus pandemic.

How do we deal with the dual risks of climate change and COVID-19? ACDR2020 will provide a platform for member countries to share updates on what they are experiencing and to discuss the future actions to be taken by focusing on two themes: (1) Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) Measures and Challenges to the Intensifying Natural Disasters, and (2) Disaster Preparedness and Response Measures Amidst COVID-19.
