# 3-2. Visiting Researchers from Member Countries

In line with the agreements arrived at the 1st International Meeting, the ADRC has been receiving visiting researchers from member countries. To date, 25 officials from member countries have taken part in this program.

In the 6th ADRC International Meeting held in February 2004, "Networking of ADRC Visiting Researchers" was proposed by Mr. V. P. Pasrija, former visiting researcher from India. This network is expected to strengthen the disaster management capacities of their countries.
